Munster claim U-18 Schools Interpro title after 11 years!



The Munster Under 18 Schools won the Interprovincial title for the first time in 11 years on Saturday with a 19-10 win over Leinster. There were 5 Crescent college starters in the side: Calvin Nash, Bailey Faloon, Jack Lyons, Billy O'Hora and Glenn Dickenson. Crescent lead 19-0 helped by try by Billy O'Hora. It was by no means one-way traffic in that first half, however, with some excellent Munster defence keeping the visitors at bay. Leinster were reduced to 14 men on 51 minutes but got back in the game when winger Jordan Larmour touched down with scrum-half David Duggan also crossing to make it 19-10. Crucially, however, both conversions were missed which allowed Munster some vital breathing space and superb defence helped the hosts see out the game and claim the Interprovincial title. Stephen Shanahan

Limerick was represented at the Cycling World Championships in Spain after the selection of 18-year-old Stephen Shanahan for Team Ireland.

Stephen from Limerick Cycling Club was picked for the Irish junior team to go to the event in Pontferrada on Saturday September 27th, becoming the first man from Limerick to represent his country at the championships since David Hourigan. Stephen Shanahan, who has been picked on provincial and national teams on many occasions in the last two years, was joined on the Irish junior team by Dylan O'Brien, Daire Feeley, Michael O'Loughin and team captain Eddie Dunbar. All of these young cyclists have performed at the highest level this year at the Junior Tour of Ireland and Junior Tour of Wales,



both of which were won by Dunbar, as well as the European Junior Championships in Switzerland and the Trofeo Karlsberg Nations Cup, all of which are esteemed prestigious road races. Stephen Shanahan had been hoping to make the cut given his previous experience, but he admitted that it was touch and go right up to the final decision at the start of September. He said: "I can't wait for it. I'm at the end of a long season now and it was my aim throughout the year to get onto the Irish team for the World Championships. "I was delighted to make the team because we have a really good crop of youngsters in Ireland and it was always going to be a tough decision for the coaches. "I had been hoping that my experience of being on Irish teams before would count in my favour. It was a Sunday night a couple of weeks ago when I got a call to say that I had made the team so I was really happy about that." Stephens Irish jersey is currently hanging in the central area as it is the first cycling jersey this school has been presented with. Below is an interview with Stephen Shanahan

1. Why are you interested in cycling?

"I am interested in cycling because my father was interested in it and I watched him racing".

2. How often do you train?

During peak season at least 5 times a week".


Crescents next outing is against Castletroy which is on the 22nd in Castletroy.

No Limbs, No Limits

At the start of October, the transition years went to see a documentary film called *no limbs no limits*.

Joanne O'Riordan is one of the seven living people born with the condition Tetra-amelia syndrome, meaning she has no limbs. She is from Millstreet, County Cork, Ireland. she took the morning off school during her Junior Cert mock examinations and met the future Taoiseach as he campaigned in Millstreet before the 2011 general election. Their meeting was filmed for television, with Kenny vowing he would not reduce disability funding if elected. O'Riordan said, "I thought he was honest. He looked like someone who wasn't going to tell a lie." When he was elected, he cut disability funding and O'Riordan wrote a letter telling him off. Her public confrontation with Enda Kenny over his spending cuts to disability funding contributed to O'Riordan's rise to fame; the government later changed its mind.

An invitation to appear on The Late Late show followed. This brought her even further to public attention. The Irish Times described O'Riordan as "one of the guests on the show in recent years who has made the most impact on viewers".

In April 2012, O'Riordan spoke before the United Nations in New York City, Talking about the use of technology and challenging the audiance to build a robot for her to use.

Her brother Stephen has made a film of her life, titled No Limbs No Limits.

Toffee Apples





Ingredients

- Granny Smith apples
- 400g golden caster sugar
- 1 tsp vinegar
- 4 tbsp golden syrup

Method

- 1. Place the apples in a large bowl, then cover with boiling water (you may have to do this in 2 batches). This will remove the waxy coating and help the caramel to stick. Dry thoroughly and twist off any stalks. Push a wooden skewer or lolly stick into the stalk end of each apple.
- 2. Lay out a sheet of baking parchment and place the apples on this, close to your stovetop. Tip the sugar into a pan along with 100ml water and set over a medium heat. Cook for 5 mins until the sugar dissolves, then stir in the vinegar and syrup. Set a sugar thermometer in the pan and boil to 140C or 'hard crack' stage. If you don't have a thermometer you can test the toffee by pouring a little into a bowl of cold water. It should harden instantly and, when removed, be brittle and easy to break. If you can still souish the toffee, continue to boil it.
- 3. Working quickly and carefully, dip and twist each apple in the hot toffee until covered, let any excess drip away, then place on the baking parchment to harden. You may have to heat the toffee a little if the temperature drops and it starts to feel thick and viscous. Leave the toffee to cool before eating. Can be made up to 2 days in advance, stored in a dry place
