There are approximately 70 children in Knocklisheen Cerntre in Co Clare and together with the Jesuit Refugee Service in Dooradoyle, we want to make their Christmas happier, by helping with Christmas Gifts. Although we know that Santa comes to all children, we also know that these children are far away from aunties and uncles, grandparents and friends and we would like to buy them gifts too. The children are living with their parents while they wait for their family's claim for asylum to be decided. The direct provision system (the Irish government provides accommodation and full board to people seeking asylum) was set up in 1999 to house people seeking asylum in the short term.

However, the reality has been that families seeking asylum have been living in state provided accommodation centres for years, a significant number more than six years.
