This year, the school show was "Me and My Girl". The leads of the play were played by Joe Barry and Emma Ryan.

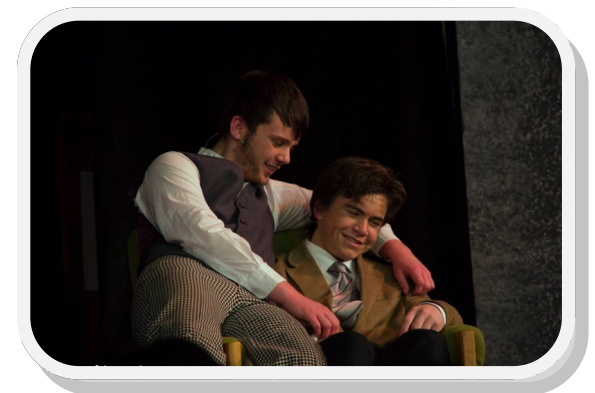

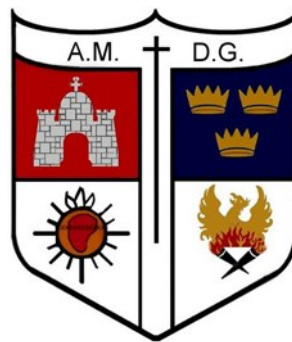
