Trio of 6th Years Earn Gaisce Award



At assembly on the 9th April, it was announced that three sixth year students had received the prestigious Silver Gaisce award. The award programme was established in 1985 (International Youth Year) by the Irish Government as a challenge from the President of Ireland to young people to set and pursue personal goals in Community Involvement, Personal Skill, Physical Recreation and an Adventure Journey with the support of an adult leader. The Award was launched in Áras an Uachtaráin in October 1985 by the President, Dr. Patrick J. Hillery who was the Award's founding patron.

Each Community Involvement, Personal Skill and Physical Recreation has to be a strict one hour a week routine for thirteen weeks; however one of these sections of your choice can be doubled to twenty-six weeks. You must also take part in an Adventure Journey or pilgrimage which must be at least one over night in a remote area of Ireland. Your award progression is monitored by a President Award leader, or PAL. Each individual who takes part in this award has an excellent opportunity to expand and improve their skills in each of the above areas, improve their personal development and each level of the award looks excellent on your Curriculum Vitae.

Congratulations to Ciara Reidy, Jennifer O'Malley and Kate Nevin who took part in Community Involvement activities such as Rugby Coaching, Personal Skills such as Computer Studies and all three took part in a two day, one over-night pilgrimage in the Tipperary area. All which have each taken a large part of their own time from their busy sixth year schedule. It is a fantastic achievement and a real honor for our school to have students at this level of this award.




Cycle Against Suicide Event


French exchange
