The Youth Assembly





On Friday 15 November the country's first Youth Assembly on climate change took place in the Dáil. It took place to discuss and determine their proposals for next steps for Ireland on Climate Action. It is also part of the celebrations to commemorate Dáil100. More than 150 young people from all 26 counties gathered for the event in the Dáil.



Once the debate concluded, they announced their recommendations on climate change.

The event was a chance for the 157 young people, aged between 10 and 17, to discuss what Ireland needs to do to tackle climate issues.

Presenting the recommendations to the minister, Salim Kajani, a delegate from Dublin, said they did not come into the Dáil for nothing, and that he hoped Minister Bruton could at least consider the proposals and implement something along their demands. He said climate change is going to affect us all, and added that the fact that the Government is basically doing nothing is "sickening".

He asked if they all looked like clowns, because he felt everything the youth say is treated as a joke. He told the minister to look into the eyes of the children in front of him, because their future is in his hands.

A fifth year from Crescent College sj was also at the Youth Assembly; Iona Logan. After interviewing Iona she has said that she believes some real progress was made and that it was an amazing experience. "To me, climate change is the most urgent issue of our times.

Decisions made today will literally determine the future of life on earth as we know it."

Iona is an active member of Fridays for Future Limerick, striking every Friday she can, she is also a Climate Ambassador with An Taisce.

CHRISTMAS COOKIE RECIPE

This delicious cookie recipe is fun and easy to make.



Preparation time

It makes a de-

30 mins to 1 hour

Cooking time

10 to 30 mins

Ingredients

- 350g plain flour, extra for rolling out
- 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda175g light soft brown sugar
- 1 free-range egg
- 4 tbsp golden syrup
- 2 tsp ground ginger
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 125g butter









To Decorate:

- Writing icing, white and black
- Smarties, Minstrels, M&M's, Chocolate chips
- Gingerbread cookie cutters

Method:

1. Sift together the flour, bicarbonate of soda, ginger and cinnamon and pour into the bowl. Add the butter and blend in a food processor until the mix looks like bread-crumbs. Stir in the sugar.

2. Lightly beat the egg and golden syrup together, add to the food processor and mix until the mixture clumps together. Take the dough out from the bowl, knead briefly until smooth, wrap in cling film and leave to chill in the fridge for 15 minutes.

3. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4. Line two baking trays with grease-proof paper.

4. Roll the dough out to a 0.5cm thickness on a lightly floured surface. Using cutters, cut out the gingerbread men shapes and place on the baking tray, leaving a gap between them.

5. Bake for 12–15 minutes, or until lightly golden-brown. Leave on the tray for 10 minutes and then move to a wire rack to finish cooling.
